COVID-19 is affecting all of us. Governor Evers has issued a Safer At Home order effective until 8:00 a.m. Friday April 24th.

At the Village Office: The Village Office is currently closed to the public. The Community Center and Handy Andy Park will not be rented through the month of April. The Public Library is currently closed. All payments for pets, utilities (no cash payments), and any other payments should be mailed to the village office at P.O. Box 276 or put in the payment box outside the main doors. The box is checked twice daily including weekends. All other correspondence can either be mailed, called in to the office, or a note can be put in the payment box. Public Works is working split shifts, longer weekend hours, and adjusted weekly hours to avoid contact. Police Department is closed to walk-in traffic. COVID-19 and the election process:

The April 7th election will prove to be challenging for everyone. As of this printing, the election will go on as scheduled and I don't expect that to change. We already have well over one hundred absentee ballots so I'm hoping this will lighten the load on election day; there are 739 registered voters in the Village of Spring Valley. On election day, voters will be directed to the most recent precautions. Clerks are still working on the possibility of not having to sign poll books but only time will tell!

POLLS ARE OPEN FOR VOTING ON ALL ELECTION DATES 7:00 A.M.—8:00 P.M. If you are in line by 8:00 p.m. closing time you will be allowed to vote.

2020 ELECTIONS:

There are three remaining elections in 2020 for the Village of Spring Valley residents living in Pierce County.

- Tuesday April 7 is the Spring Election. Three Trustees, District 9 County Supervisor, three referendums, three school board members, and the Presidential Preference Vote are on the ballot.
- Tuesday August 11th Fall Primary for Federal contests if the field of candidates needs to be narrowed. There will most likely be a primary this year.
- Tuesday November 3rd General Election for President and US House and Senate seats.

If you live in Village of Spring Valley, St. Croix County, you also have a Special Election to fill the seat vacated by former US Representative Sean Duffy in District 7. This election is May 18th. Voting location remains at the

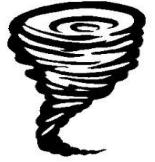
SPRING VALLEY COMMUNITY SAFETY DAY

If you haven't registered your pet, please do so ASAP. They were due April 1st. Unregistered pets list will be going to the police department soon.



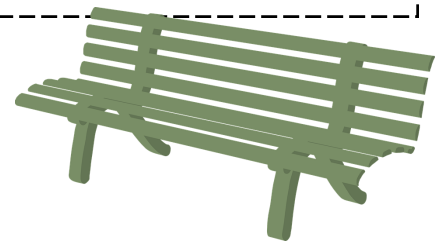
Board of Review

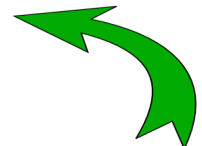

Construction Updates...

The Village was awarded a \$1 million grant to put towards the Eau Galle Road project, which includes both utility infrastructure and surface. Parts of the project are expected to begin soon, starting with the bridge.

Other possible projects include Newman Ave in front of the Emergency Services Building and the Glade Avenue bridge.

The State Road 29 project will NOT start until 2021.
