The Village Office is currently closed to the public.

VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVES—BEWARE! Voter registration drives will increase in 2020. These organizations are NOT affiliated with The Village and while most organizations are legitimate, this is also an area of opportunity for scammers. Be aware that voter registration requires personal information such as DOB and DL number. Never give personal information to anyone you don't know and trust. The safest way to register includes online at myvote.wi.gov, by US Mail to The Village of Spring Valley PO Box 276, or by dropping your registration off at The Village Hall drop box at E121 South Second Street. Please call the office if you are unsure, 715-778-5635.

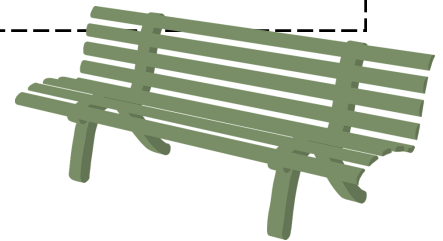
The Public Service Commission has lifted its moratorium on utility disconnections for non-payment effective July 25th. Late fees can be applied to all accounts past due before March 24th and after July 14th.



Consider purchasing a Memorial Bench

Memorial benches are available for purchase through the Spring Valley Village Office and may be installed at any time. The placement will be determined by the Village Board or Public Works Department, with your preference in mind. Benches are currently being placed in Handy Andy Park, along the Highway 29 walking trail.

You may also have a tree planted in memory or in honor of someone. Call the village office for details.



WHERE DOES YOUR MONEY GO?

PROPERTY TAXES-The Village collects an average property tax bill of \$3960 but only \$1080 of this stays at The Village as general fund. The balance is paid to the county, school district and Vo-Tech.



PET LICENSES-The Village collects \$20 for a pet license but a portion of this is paid to Pierce County. The Village also pays a vet bill and shelter fee for every dog or cat that is brought to The Village as a stray.

BUILDING PERMITS-For every building permit a resident pays to The Village, 90% is returned to All-Croix for inspections.
