### **Elections:**

April 6<sup>th</sup> Spring Election will be the last election for 2021. Voting for School Board, Village President and Village Trustees, State Superintendent of Public Instruction, District 3 Court of Appeals Judge.

### COVID-19 CONTINUES:

<u>The Village Office</u> is currently closed to the public. Any correspondence or payments for pets, utilities, etc. should be mailed to the Village office at P.O. Box 276 or put in the payment box outside the main doors. The box is checked twice daily, including weekends. <u>The Police Department</u> is closed to walk-in traffic. Vehicle registrations & other services by appointment only.

# <u>Construction Updates.</u> The following is direct from WisDOT project engineers regarding the State Rd 29 project:

Construction work will be starting on STH 29 in Spring Valley on Monday, April 5th . The construction project limits are CTH CC in Pierce County to STH 128 in St. Croix County. Work on the project will include replacement of the retaining wall along Hwy 29 in Spring Valley, repairs to and an overlay of the deck of the bridge over the Eau Galle River, grading, culvert pipe replacements in multiple locations, milling and asphaltic paving. Work is tentatively scheduled to be completed in early July.



Following are impacts to traffic:

- Traffic will be reduced to one lane with flagging operations at various times throughout the duration of the project.
- The bridge over the Eau Galle River will be reduced to one lane while work is completed in two stages. Traffic at the bridge will be controlled with the use of temporary traffic signals.

- During the installation of new culvert pipes traffic will be detoured using CTH CC, CTH G, STH 72 and STH 128. The dates of these detours have not yet been finalized.

Emergency vehicle access will be maintained throughout the project.

Additional information to note: Village of Spring Valley will be replacing a water main from west Cleveland St/dental office intersection to McKay Ave. in early May. There will be a detour in place for this work as well.

### DUE DATE CHANGE ON UTILITY BILLS, PLEASE READ!



\*\* Per our PSC rate structure, "a late payment charge of 3 percent but not less than 50 cents will be added to bills not paid within <u>20</u> days of issuance." This had been gradually extended to 30 days over the past few years and needs to be brought back into compliance with PSC regulations.

**Effective with this March 31 utility bill,** the due date on water/sewer utility bills will be the 20th day of the following month as dictated in our current rate structure. Late fees will be applied to any payment received after that day, regardless of postage date. This information is also being printed on the back of 1<sup>st</sup> quarter utility bills. ### NOTES & REMINDERS FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

Please make sure that house numbers are clearly posted on your homes in case of the need for Emergency

Services. Make sure trees, hanging baskets and flags are not blocking visibility of the numbers.

- All dogs must be on a leash when walking. Animals must be contained by kennel or some type of fencing while outside in vards to eliminate running out at vehicles or pedestrians
- Fecal matter in yards and out walking ٠ must be picked up and discarded

Sec. 6-10. Depositing of fecal matter on public or private property prohibited; exemption. (a) The owner or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter of such animal to be deposited upon any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed by the owner or person in charge of such dog or animal. Citation amount is \$169.50.
