DRIVEWAY PERMITS

All driveways installed, altered, changed, replaced, or extended shall meet ordinance 38-192 and must be approved. Failure to comply with this ordinance may result in the driveway having to be replaced. The ordinance can be found on the village web site under Government/Ordinances/Driveways. A FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM THE POLICE DEPT:

ATV/UTV EQUIPMENT/RIDING LAWS

- Headlamp/Taillamp required when operating on road
- License Plates are required to be displayed on back
- Registration decal front half of ATV facing outward
- Headgear for all operators and passengers under 18 years of age
- ATV Safety certificate required for operators born on/ after January 1, 1988
- Speed for in town in 10 MPH
- No ATV/UTV traffic on McKay Ave.

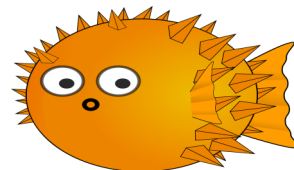
