#### PARTISAN PRIMARY-AUGUST 9TH

This election is to narrow the field of candidates in individual political parties. This means the voter will select the party of his or her choice, then within that party you will vote for one of several candidates in each contest. Voting for candidates of more than one party may invalidate the ballot. The voter must cast a vote for individual candidates. Early in-person voting runs August 2-5 at the Village Office. YOU MUST SET AN APPOINTMENT. Call the village office 715-778-5635.

If you put in a pool which at any point is greater than 18" you need a pool permit; it does not matter if it is above or below ground. If not enclosed in a permanent building, it must be completely enclosed by a minimum 6' fence with no holes/voids larger than 4". If a portable pool has a raised deck around the entire pool perimeter with an attached enclosed railing at least 36" on top, the enclosure requirement is waived. Pools are allowed on rear or side lots only, three foot setback for entire project including fence. In no case shall the water line of any pool be less than six feet from any lot line. All driveways installed, altered, changed, replaced, or extended shall meet ordinance 38-192 and must be approved. Failure to comply with this ordinance may result in the driveway having to be replaced. Our favorite little jeep, as well as the new monkey bars and a small portion of fence, were partially crushed by a tree, that fell during one of the previous storms that recently hit Spring Valley. The insurance claim was filed & we are waiting to proceed to replace the damaged equipment. The remainder of the playground weathered the storm well with no damage done & is open for use.

## A FRIENDLY REMINDER FROM THE POLICE DEPT:

ATV/UTV EQUIPMENT/RIDING LAWS

- Headlamp/Taillamp required when operating on road
- License Plates are required to be displayed on back
- Registration decal front half of ATV facing outward
- Headgear for all operators and passengers under 18 years of age
- ATV Safety certificate required for operators born on/ after January 1, 1988
- Speed for in town in 10 MPH
- No ATV/UTV traffic on McKay Ave.
