Dog and Cat Licenses

All dogs and cats kept within the Village MUST be licensed. Dogs and cats more than 5 months of age shall obtain a license annually. The cost is \$20 for a neutered/spayed dog/cat or \$30 for an intact dog/cat. If you have not registered your pet, please do so as soon as possible. Please be sure to include proof of rabies vaccination when you submit your application.



Reminder - Village Ordinance

The owner or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter of such animal to be deposited upon any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed by the owner or person in charge of such dog or animal.

Garbage



Paul's Industrial Garage provides garbage pick-up. Please have garbage at the curbside by 6:00 a.m. They can be reached at (715)792-5209.
** Please note: The only holiday that garbage is not picked up by P.I.G. is Christmas Day.

Recycling

Recycling bins are located across from the fire hall and are accessible 24/7. They accept glass, tin, aluminum & plastic, mixed paper and cardboard and newspaper.

Pierce County

The Pierce County Recycling Center accepts recyclable as well as many non-recyclable items. Hours are Monday- Friday 6:00 - 4:30 and the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month from 8:00 - noon. They can be reached at 273-3092 with any questions.

From the Water/Sewer Department

Billing is done quarterly in January, April, July and October with bills being due on the 20th of the month. If for some reason you can not make your payment within that time frame please come in and we can set up a deferred payment agreement. Water bills can be paid at the village office Monday through Friday from 8:00 - 4:30, dropped in the payment box in the front of the building or mailed to the office.

House Numbers

All houses are to have posted street addresses. Numbers or letters must be uniform in appearance and not less than 2 1/2" in height on a background not less than 3" and placed where they are easily and readily seen from the street upon which the building abuts. Buildings on an alley should also have numbers that can be seen from the alley.

From the Police Department

- In the past few years, swimming pools have changed. With the new soft-sided pools, more and more are making their way into residents' yards. If you are considering purchasing a pool or already own one, please remember that all pools within the village that have a depth of 1.5 feet or more REQUIRE A PERMIT and MUST be inside an enclosure with a fenced height of at least SIX feet. See the village office to obtain a permit. Any pools within the village without permits are subject to daily fines.

- Please remember that all yards must be mowed throughout the summer months. Grass clippings CANNOT be left on the streets or sidewalks.

Building Permits

If you are remodeling, adding a deck or addition, doing any electrical or plumbing work or any other home improvements, permits are required before you start. Please call the village office before starting any work to request the necessary permits or if you have any questions. Permit information can be found on the web site at springvalleywi.com

Spring Valley Winter Reminders

Winter parking will be enforced every night of the week between November 1st and March 31st. Village ordinance does not allow vehicles to be parked on village streets between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Officers will issue parking tickets to vehicles parked illegally during these hours, regardless of snow-fall. If your car experiences a mechanical difficulty, or will have overnight guests, you must contact an officer to avoid a parking ticket.

Shoveling: Pursuant to 38-150 of the Village Code of Ordinances, the owner, occupant or person in charge of any lot which fronts or adjoins a sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk clear of all snow and ice. If snow accumulates on a sidewalk due to natural means and/or by any other means, the sidewalk shall be cleared of all snow and/or ice within 24 hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on the sidewalk. Sidewalks are to be kept clear of snow and ice to a minimum of four feet in width. If ice has formed on a sidewalk in such a way that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians. If you do not follow the above ordinance, the Village will remove the snow and/or ice for you at a minimum charge of \$100.00 per hour.
