NOTICE OF GENERAL ELECTION - ABSENTEE VOTING TUESDAY NOVEMBER 8, 2022 VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. **Photo ID must be provided** before an absentee ballot may be issued. If you need to register, contact the local clerk listed below.

To Obtain an Absentee Ballot You Must Make Request in Writing or request online at myvote.wi.gov

Contact your Municipal Clerk and request an application for an absentee ballot to be sent to you for the election. You may also request an absentee ballot by letter or you can register and request an absentee ballot by going to <u>myvote.wi.gov</u>. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent if different, and your signature. Attach a copy of your photo ID. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail or in person.

Making Application to Receive an Absentee Ballot by Mail

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is 5:00 p.m. Thursday November 3rd 2022. NOTE: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an Absentee Ballot in Person (Early Voting)

You may also vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office (early voting) or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person. Early in person voting days and times are <u>set by individual clerks</u> but cannot start before Tuesday October 25th 2022 and must end by Sunday November 6th 2022. See below.

There is no absentee voting or voter registration on Monday November 7th 2022
