#### FROM THE CLERK'S OFFICE:

- We have installed a new phone system throughout the Village Hall. When you call you will be greeted by an automated attendant and given several options such as dial by name, dial by extension, direct connect, or leave a general message.
- Public Works notice: f you believe you have a blocked sewer line call Public Works first. If you or your plumber work on it and then call Public Works, the Village will NOT be paying your plumber bill. Neither you nor your plumber should be lifting a municipal manhole cover.!
- 2023 Elections: Tuesday February 21 Spring Primary if needed, Tuesday April 4 Spring Election.
- Sewer fee increase: Due to increasing costs the sewer utility raised base fees by 20% in order to balance their budget. Most residents run a 5/8" line which currently costs \$96/quarter base fee. This will increase to \$115.20, an annual total increase of \$76.80. Please review the back of your utility bill for all meter size increases. This will be effective with your March 31, 2023 billing.
- Revaluation of all Spring Valley properties coming in 2024-watch for further details.

**NEW ORDINANCE FOR 2023:** It is now legal to keep up to 5 chickens in the Village. The addition of Section 6-13(e) will be on the Village web site in January. Residents who wish to keep chickens may do so with certain guidelines. A permit will be required and you will need a Livestock Premises Registration. Both forms will also be online and available in the Clerk's office in January.

The Village has a Revolving Loan Rehab program for low to mod-



erate income (LMI) households for improvements including siding, roofing, furnace, electrical, plumbing, improvements for handicap accessibility, etc. It is not for remodels or new construction. These are 0% interest loans and do not need to be paid back until you sell your home or it's no longer your primary residence. There are also loans available for LMI occupied rental housing units. ## WINTER SNOW REMOVAL STREETS AND SIDEWALKS



Winter Parking restrictions went into effect November 1, 2022 There is no parking allowed on Village streets between the hours of 2:00 am-6:00 am. Spring Valley Police Department will be issuing tickets to vehicles parked illegally during these hours, regardless of snowfall. Public Works will be issuing tickets if they are plowing during these hours and your vehicle is parked in their way. Parking will be enforced November 1st thru March 31st. If you are experiencing mechanical difficulty or have overnight guests please contact the police department to avoid a ticket.



#### HOMEOWNERS RESPONSIBLIITY TO SHOVEL THEIR WALK:

Each homeowner is responsible for keeping their sidewalk clear of all snow and ice. If snow accumulates on a sidewalk due to natural means and/or by any other means you have 24 hours from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on the sidewalk to clear it. If ice has formed on a sidewalk in such a way that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians. If you fail to remove the snow and/or ice after you have been notified the Village will do so at a minimum charge of \$100.00.

After a snowfall, check the con-

dition of your mailbox and post. Keeping snow from in front of the mailbox is the owner's responsibility. Make sure your mailbox is on a study post; the Village does not reimburse if your mailbox comes down due to force of snow.



## 2023 Dog and Cat Licensing

All dogs and cats must be registered by April 1,

2023. If you don't have a registration form you can find one on the Village web site

www.springvalleywi.com or call the Village office and we can send you one. Check your property tax bill envelope, you should have gotten one in there. Owners who fail to license their dogs and cats are subject to a \$169.50 fine. A current Vaccination Certificate must be on file for your pet.
