*MAY 2nd-6th HYDRANT FLUSHING If your water appears cloudy or dark, let it run until clear. Remember to check your water before washing clothes to prevent staining. Residents with water softeners should also check the cycle time of their units so that the softener does not regenerate during this time period.

*MAY 9th-13th CURBSIDE BRUSH PICK-UP. Spring is here it's time to clean up our yards. Leave cleared brush and branches from your property at the curb and the guys will pick up during the week as they see it. If we miss you, call and we'll send them over! 778-5635 REMEMBER NO YARD WASTE IS ACCEPTED!

Any time through out the summer use the compost area in the business park for your yard waste and brush trimmings. The compost area is located in the

business park just past Ultimate Coatings; watch for the sign. Disposing of yard waste in ditches or levees costs every tax payer money!!



Reminder-there will be fines for leaving junk/garbage at the recycle center and illegal dumping at the compost site

<u>**DEDUCT METERS**</u> may be rented from the Village Office. The purpose of a deduct meter may be for watering gardens or

yards in drier weather or filling small pools. The meter will measure water used and then that will allow sewer charges on the utility billing to be credited \$5.00/1000gals of water used. There is a rental fee of 15.00 up to 2 weeks, anything after 2 weeks needs Public Works approval.

NOTES & REMINDERS FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Please make sure that house numbers are clearly posted on your homes in case of the need for Emergency Services. Make sure trees, hanging baskets and flags are not blocking visibility of the numbers.
- Sec §6-6/B-1 All dogs must be on a leash when walking. Animals must be contained by kennel or some type of fencing while outside in yards to eliminate running out at vehicles or pedestrians
- Fecal matter in yards and out walking must be picked up and discarded

Sec. §6-10. Depositing of fecal matter on public or private property prohibited; exemption. (a) The owner or person in charge of any dog or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter of such animal to be deposited upon any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed by the owner or person in charge of such dog or animal. Citation amount is \$169.50.

Section §6-13(e) Keeping of Chickens. Chickens will now be allowed on a **trial basis** in the Village with the proper permit. License year runs January 1 –

December 31 and the cost is \$20.00. A Livestock Premises Registration is required for licensing. Full ordinance and permit application can be found on the web site

Section §58-591(g)(1) Portable Storage Containers — Temporary Use (30 days) will now be allowed with specific guidelines. A permit will be required along with a \$20 fee. Full ordinance is on our website

<u>Utility Payments</u> are due by the 20th of the month when utility billings have been received. Some residents have been paying with their bank accounts, which is a great way of paying. Please be aware that it seems to be taking 7 to 10 days for us to receive the payment, so be sure to allow enough time that it will be received in our office before the 20th.

MEMORIAL BENCHES are a great way to keep memories alive. When placed in the community with the names of those departed they can be constant reminders of the impact on our lives individuals had.
