- 2. Public Works equipment costs were reviewed. \$83,464.50 for plow truck has been spent. When the ditch mower is purchased, we will decide on Bremer Bank or state trust fund, total not to exceed \$100,000.
- 3. Pantry at SVHRC updated pantry costs include increased costs from Durand Builders and appliance costs. Will recommend to full Board total pantry cost \$84,093.00.
- 4. Possibility of 55+ 4-plex to be built on north playground. Brunkhorst will talk with the builder she has been talking with.
- 5. No 2022 year-end review is ready yet. Audit field work will be done next week.
- 6. Emerson was directed to ask County Clerk Feuerhelm if the Village could make an offer on the old bank building corer of So. 2nd St. and McKay Ave.
