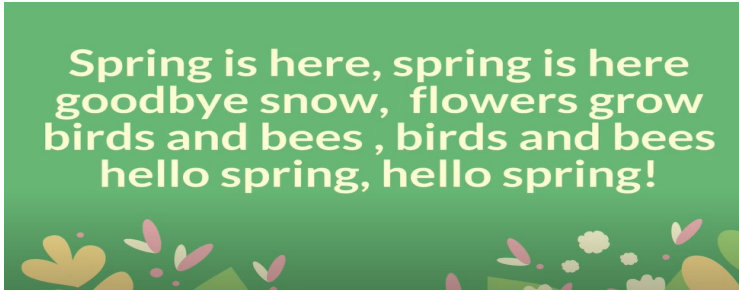

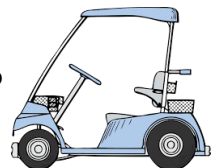

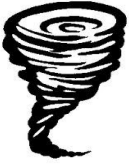
Bicycles are not allowed on Village sidewalks. Please follow the rules and ride cautiously on the right side of the street with the traffic.

Wisconsin's 2024 Statewide Tornado Drill is scheduled for April 11. During this annual event, everyone is encouraged to prepare for tornadoes and severe storms that frequently occur in the state during spring and summer months. **The drill will take place at 1:45 p.m. and 6:45 p.m. on April 11.**

Here are some important details:

- **Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week:** This awareness campaign runs from **April 8 to April 12** and aims to educate and prepare residents for potential tornadoes and severe weather conditions.
- **Drill Participation:** Schools, businesses, and individuals at home are encouraged to practice going to their nearest tornado shelter during the drills, as if there were an actual tornado warning in effect.
- **NOAA Weather Radio Tests:** Wisconsin's National Weather Service offices will conduct **NOAA Weather Radio tests** during the drill times. These tests can be heard only if you are actively listening to NOAA Weather Radios or have one programmed to activate on test alerts.
- **Outdoor Warning Sirens:** Many communities may choose to test their **outdoor warning sirens** during the drill times.

Drill Status: If there is a threat of severe weather in Wisconsin on April 11, the statewide drills will be **postponed until Friday, April 12**. However, if severe weather is also expected on Friday, the drill will be **cancelled**. [You can check the drill status on the ReadyWisconsin website by 10:00 a.m. on April 11¹.](#)
